# Hi! Kamusta!

## Greeting in Tagalog

Learning a new language is one thing and learning how to talk to people in their native language is a whole different story. This means second-guessing every word and wishing that people came with subtitles or pause buttons. But that doesn't have to be the case when greeting Tagalog speakers. In this lesson, we will talk about the spanish origin but quintessentially Tagalog word, **Kamusta**.

**Kamusta**, pronounced /kah + moos + tah/ is your gateway word to building Tagalog vocabulary. If you like multipurpose words, then you'll like **Kamusta**. It can mean several things. Consider:

- Hi! / Hello!
- Hey!
- How are you?
- How's the ...?

Let's talk about these, shall we?

### Hi! / Hello!

Forget about **Mabuhay!** and **Ikinagagalak kitang makilala**, when it comes to greeting people, whether a friend or a stranger, **Kamusta** is the perfect start for any conversation. Use it like you would use "Hi!" or "Hello". A smiling face and a slightly waving hand would be perfect with it too.

Even if you can't speak fluent Tagalog (for now), the person that you just greeted will know that you did your research more than hearing **Mabuhay** in the airport or tourism videos.

P.S. Never use **Mabuhay** as a greeting. It vaguely means "Long Live". It's never gonna happen.

### Hey!

We already talked about **Kamusta** as "Hi" / "Hello" but you can further brag your budding Tagalog vocabulary by saving **Musta** instead of **Kamusta**. This is best used when you are already close to the person you are greeting. So next time you see your Tagalog friend, just greet them with a **Musta**!

## How are you?

**Kamusta**, as I mentioned before, is borrowed from Spanish. It came from the Spanish sentence "*Cómo estás?*" meaning, "How are you?". Due to Philippines' long history with Spain, we had a lot of time Tagalizing it into our version. So, all the time you are using **Kamusta** as "Hi" or "Hello!" or even "Hey!", you are actually saying "How are you?".

It's basically like asking "How do you do?" but not expecting any actual answer. It's polite... and kinda superficial. BUT - If you do want to know how they are, you still say **Kamusta** or better yet:

- **Kamusta Ka?** - How are you?

**Ka** means "you" in Tagalog. Following that pattern if **Kayo** is "you guys" or "y'all", how would you say "How are you guys?" to a group of your friends or acquaintances?
